About the Climate Accelerator Program

The Climate Accelerator Program, a Youth of India Foundation initiative, aims to Empower Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in India by enhancing their capabilities in the area of - Employment, Environment and Education - in the North-Eastern region of India including the North Bengal region of West Bengal. Despite the crucial role they play in addressing grassroots issues, many CSOs across the country face challenges like limited funding, lack of digital and technical expertise, lack of regulatory compliance, inadequate monitoring, and weak governance. The program, through a phased approach, aims to strengthen and Evolve CSO capacity and help them address these barriers by providing tailored technical assistance, enabling them to implement impactful and sustainable projects for socio-environmental development.

Challenges **Civil Society Organizations** Face

Limited Financial Resources:

Most CSOs operate with minimal funding, making it difficult to scale their operations.

Technical and **Operational Capacities:**

Many organizations lack expertise in areas like project management, fundraising, and various other technical skills.

Low Connectivity to Networks:

Certain CSOs struggle with gaining visibility and form strategic partnerships.

Comprehensive Monitoring and Evaluation Protocol:

Poor impact-reporting and documentation mechanism, without a robust M&E, hampers their ability to build credibility.

Ineffective Governance Framework:

Lack of robust organizational structures and leadership can affect long-term sustainability.


Digital Tools:

Lack of knowledge in adopting digital tools for transformation and impact.

Regulatory Reporting Compliances:

CSOs often experience in meeting legal and regulatory requirements for transparency, financial reporting and project documentation.

Objectives of the Climate Accelerator Program

We aim to provide:

Financial Sustainability:

Guidance and assistance in securing grants and other funding opportunities to drive project implementation and organizational growth.

> Technical Assistance:

Tailored advisory services in areas like advocacy, impact measurement, and communications to ensure CSOs can manage projects successfully.

> Mentorship:

One-on-One Mentorship from experts in various fields to provide guidance in scaling operations, improving project design, and enhancing leadership capacity.

Capacity Building and **Organizational Development:**


Enhance the internal operational capacities of CSOs through digital transformation and making them regulatory compliant.

Networking, Collaboration, and Visibility:

Strengthen the connections between CSOs, stakeholders, and communities to foster collaboration and increase visibility.

Sustainability and Community **Empowerment:**

Support long-term sustainability and empower marginalized communities to play active roles in social development.

Impact Audience

CSOs:

Organizations focused on grassroots efforts related to various societal issues and taboos across different thematic areas.

Marginalized Communities:

Communities facing societal challenges and taboos, particularly women, tribal groups, and rural communities.

Demographic Focus:

The Program will focus on the **North-Eastern Region** and **Aspirational Districts/Blocks of India.** Applications will be specifically solicited from CSOs working in these areas.

Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Framework

A robust M&E framework will be implemented to track progress, measure impact, and ensure continuous improvement. The framework will include:

Initial Needs Assessment:

Conduct a thorough assessment of each participating CSO at the start of the Program to tailor **Support Measures.**

Continuous Performance Measurement:

Monitor CSO performance through regular check-ins, using **Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)** to track progress.

Reporting Requirements:

CSOs will submit monthly activity reports, quarterly financial reports, and annual comprehensive reports.

Impact Assessment:

Conduct baseline studies, mid-term evaluations, and final assessments to measure the long-term impact of CSO projects.

Program Structure

The Climate Accelerator Program will be implemented in the following phases:

Phase 1: Foundation Building (Year 1)

Focus on basic capacity building, project management training, and establishing organizational structures.

Phase 2: Growth and Development (Year 2)

Advanced training in project design and implementation, enhancing M&E skills, and expanding networks.

Phase 3: Scaling and Sustainability (Year 3)

Focus on long-term sustainability strategies, advanced policy advocacy, and preparing for larger projects and international recognition.
